Dear Mr. Lanfrit:

Pursuant to your request, Dolan & Dean Consulting Engineers, LLC (D&D) has reviewed the summer camp operation at Cedar Hill Prep School by discussing hours, enrollment, staffing, etc. with Galen Smith, who runs the camp. In addition, we have reviewed our 2011 and 2017 studies for Cedar Hill Prep School, to compare school and camp activity.

The camp enrollment is 250 to 300 children. Students attend camp three, four or five days per week. The camp day starts at 7:00 a.m. and ends at 4:00 p.m. Arrivals vary from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. By 4:15 p.m. the majority of the campers are picked up, although approximately 5% stay later for aftercare and are picked up by 6:30 p.m.

Many siblings attend the camp, so there are often two children per car for drop off.

The camp also provides a van service for pick up and drop off. Approximately 30% of the children use the van service and there are 2 to 3 vans to transport children.

There are 50 to 60 staff members but only 20 to 25 staff vehicles. Many of the camp counselors are college students who carpool.

In the four years that the camp has operated at Cedar Hill Prep School, they have never needed a police officer to facilitate ingress/egress, and have not experienced significant traffic backups. Similar to what occurs at Cedar Hill Prep School, some parents use the adjacent swim club parking lot for pick-up and drop-off.

Using this information, the following data was used to develop the trip generation estimates in Table I:

- > 280 students total (since not all attend every day and there are there are absences)
- > 30 students use the van service
- > 10 students per van
- > 250 students are dropped off by parents
- > 2 students per car = 125 parent cars for morning drop off
- > 15 students stay for after care and are picked up during the evening peak hour
- > 235 students are picked up in the afternoon
- > 2 students per car = 118 parent cars for afternoon pick up
- ≥ 25 staff vehicles

D&D performed traffic counts at the Cedar Hill Prep School driveways in September/October 2011 and again in March 2017. Table II summarizes the trip generation recorded as well as the enrollment at the time the counts were performed.

Camp trip generation is comparable to trip generation counted at Cedar Hill Prep School during the school year. Roadway volumes tend to be lower in the summer than during the school year. When camp is in session, the site driveways are expected to operate comparable to, or better than during the school year.
