Existing Conditions

The project site is located in the Township of Franklin, Somerset County, New Jersey. The property is located in the R-10 (Residential) zone district and contains a total tract area of approximately 2.77 acres. Access to the property is provided via an existing 40 foot wide right of way that intersects Belmar Street. The surrounding property is primarily residential in nature with a church to the south-east. The parcel is currently occupied by woods and brush.

Project Description

The proposed development of the site includes a major subdivision with five (5) new single family lots which will be connected to Belmar Street via a new roadway. A sand filter basin with underdrains is proposed to address the stormwater management for this project. The five new lots will be serviced by public water through a connection to the existing water main along Belmar Street. An 8" sanitary sewer line is proposed to connect to the existing 8" sanitary within Belmar Street.

The existing site currently contains zero acres of impervious area. The impervious coverage for the new development is to be minimized to reduce the impact on the watershed. While the zone allows 60% impervious cover, the project proposes a 38.1% impervious coverage.

Stormwater runoff from the site will be mitigated by the use of low impact development techniques and the construction of structural BMPs. For the purposes of stormwater management, the site will have one sand filter basin for water quality and water quantity control. The storm drainage report has been prepared by VCEA and will be submitted with the full application to the Franklin Township Planning Board.

The existing site condition has one point of access in the form of a right of way that intersect with Belmar Street. While there is expected to be an increase in traffic due to the addition of new homes, the increase is considered to be minor as only five new houses are being added to an already well-established development.

According to the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), Panel 188 of 301 for Somerset County, NJ (Figure 8), the property is located in Zone X, which is considered to be outside of the 500-year flood plain. The NJDEP I-Map 2002 wetland mapping (Figure 7) does not indicate freshwater wetland or wetland buffers on the property.

No acid-producing soils are anticipated on-site, nor are any acid producing soil expected to be exposed.

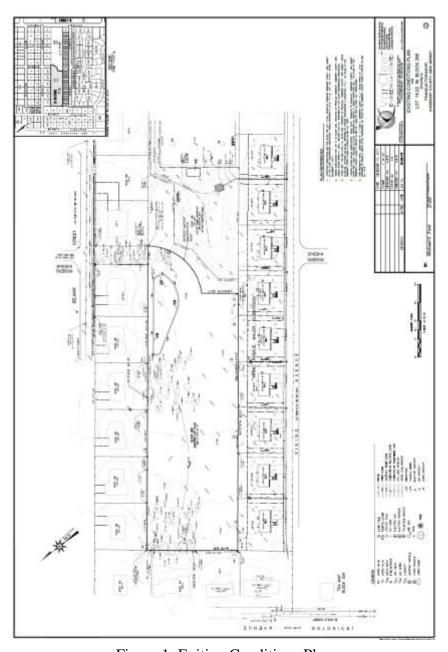


Figure 1: Exiting Conditions Plan

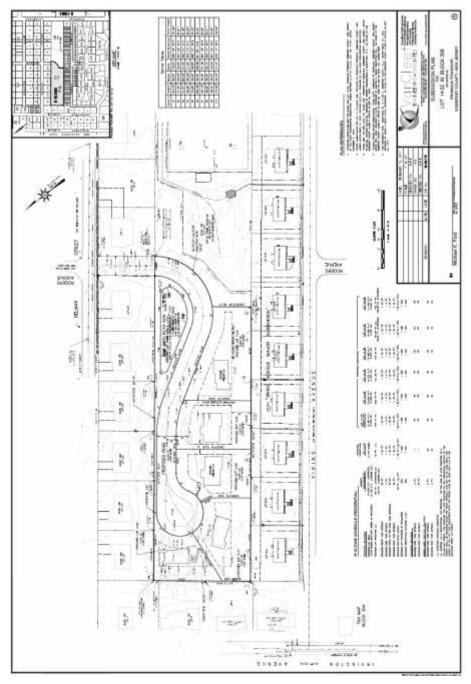


Figure 2: Proposed Condition Plan (Site Plan)

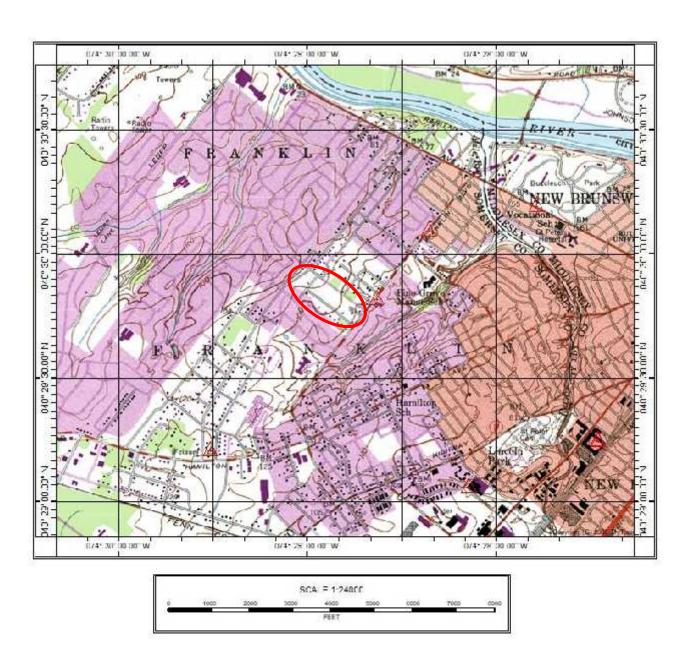


Figure 3: USGS Site Location Site circled in red.

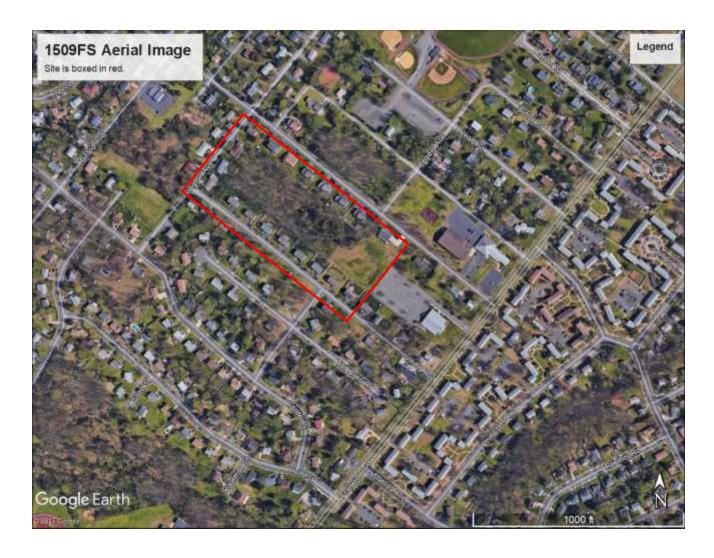
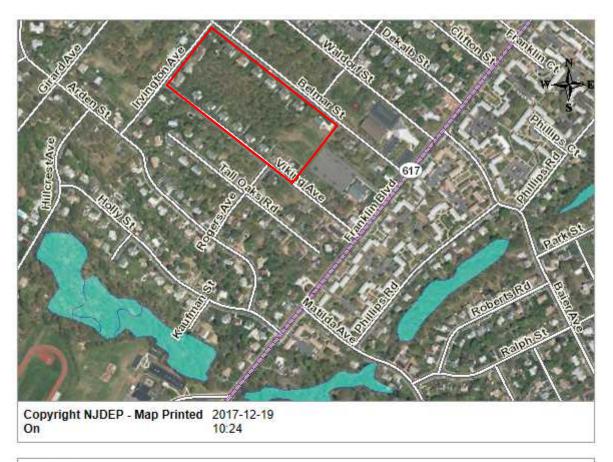


Figure 6: Aerial Map





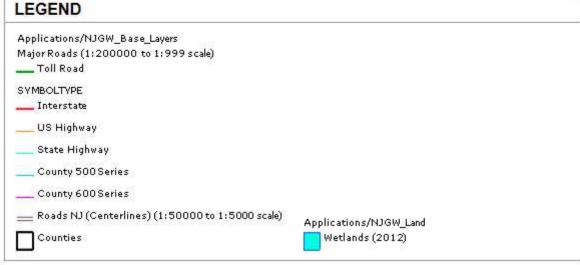


Figure 7: NJDEP I- Map with wetland areas in region.

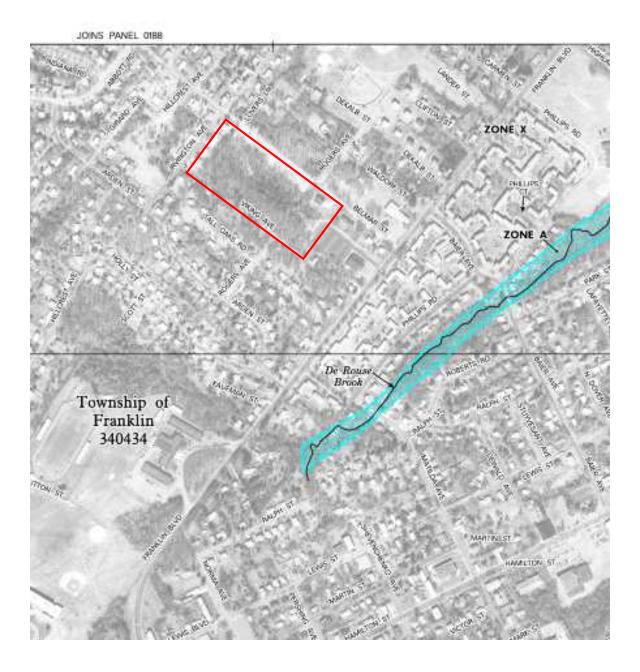


Figure 8: FEMA Flood Zone Map Site area is boxed in red.
