Township Manager Answers Your Questions

Bob Vornlocker was named Township Manager in October, 2012. Prior to taking the position, he was a Franklin Police Officer for 25 years and the Township's Special Projects Manager for one year.

Mr. Vornlocker has an open-door policy, and over the past year has answered many questions from residents. Without mentioning names or addresses, these are some of the most frequently-asked questions.

How can we lower taxes?

Simple. Reduce spending. However, there are limits to where cuts can be made. Liability insurance, pensions, and debt payments are all inflexible and make up a large portion of the budget. Social security, salaries, health insurance, aid to the first aid squads and senior transportation are examples of areas where some adjustments can be made, but only to a certain extent. Payroll and health insurance through layoffs, construction projects and vehicle purchases are places that can but cut be cut. But with cuts come reduction of services.

If I have a complaint, who should I call?

One of the changes I made when I became Manager is placing each of the our Department Head's business cards on the shelf in my outer office. We are here to serve the residents, and residents should not hesitate to call with their questions.

Generally, the Departments who receive the most calls are Health (908-231-7155), Planning (732-873-2500, ext. 6271) and Animal Control (732-873-2500, ext. 6255). They are followed by the Municipal Court (732-873-2500, ext. 6262), Revenue (732-873-7284) and Public Works (732-249-7800).

If you don't know which Department to call, you can contact my office and we will direct you to the proper office (732-873-2500, ext. 6201).

When are they going to repave my street?

The Engineering Department has done a survey of all the streets in the Township and prioritized them according to their condition. If you want to check where your street is on the list or make a suggestion that Engineering look at your street, contact them at 732-873-2500, ext. 6230.

Who made that decision about our neighborhood? Nobody asked me or the people on my block, and we certainly have a different opinion about the situation.

Decisions are made based on the information on hand. Residents are urged to come to Council meetings to share their opinions. The proposed agendas are available before the meetings, and the Council meetings are televised live and rebroadcast on Comcast channel 29 or Verizon channel 33. The Township has several advisory

committees, all open to the public; and their meetings are posted on the Township website and listed in the Township newsletter. Residents are also encouraged to volunteer to serve on Township committees. A listing of volunteer opportunities is available on the website and in the Municipal Clerk's office.

The inspector gave me a violation notice. What can you do about it?

Honestly, nothing. The Township follows strict guidelines and statutes from the State of New Jersey. Our inspectors are certified to uphold those guidelines and statutes. If you think there are special circumstances that might make a difference, we are willing to sit down and listen. There are official ways to appeal a decision, and we will be happy to give you the contact information.

What part of your job do you enjoy the most?

Seeing a project through to completion. And in 12 months, which seem to have flown by, there are many accomplishments. We passed the 2013 budget, clarifying and updating the line items for each department to better manage their budget. And we stayed within budget and have a surplus going into 2014. We maintained our AA+ bond rating and had no significant comments on the annual audit. After several years of cutbacks, we were able to restart the annual resurfacing schedule for our streets and purchased much-needed vehicles for Police and Public Works.

What part of your job do you enjoy the least?

Having to say 'no' to good ideas and plans that just aren't in the budget. I, along with the rest of the Township staff, find that often there just isn't enough time in a single day to get everything done. There are weeks when evening meetings are scheduled for four of the five weekdays. I am not complaining or wouldn't trade the job for anything; but it can be tiring.

Frequently Asked Questions?

Several residents called or e-mailed after reading the trivia in the Franklin Times Fall, 2013 Local 101 article. It is always good to receive feedback, and the positive response is greatly appreciated. Below are some of the items discussed.

The **municipal seal** was adopted in December 1962. It was designed by Stanley Schwartz and shows the 13 stars of the American flag, a soldier of the American Revolution, a plowshare and the date of incorporation, 1798. The soldier is holding a scroll with the words à pas de géant, French for "a giant step."

Several streets in the Levitt development are named after New York Giant football players and personnel (Mel Tripplet, Pat Summerall, Tom Landry, Vince Lombardi, Emlen Tunnell, Frank Gifford, and Rosie Grier). Former residents Elaine and Howard Fox, who have since passed away, built the homes in the Foxwood section of Somerset and bought the adjoining land that became the Levitt development. Howard was an avid Giants fan. When the Giants won the 1956 NFL championship, he was designing the street layout in the subdivision, and he named them after the team personnel. Before he started building, he sold the approved subdivision to Levitt. Bill Braham said in "Franklin Township, Somerset County, NJ: A History" that Levitt and Sons had invested \$20 million into the new development called "Strathmore at Franklin." The first 14 homes were ready for occupancy in July, 1964.

Developers have occasionally asked for suggestions on street names. The Engineering Department will ask them to consider the names of deceased police officers or historic local figures.

There was an increase in the water rates and I wasn't expecting it.

The increase from \$4.72 to \$5.66 per thousand gallons and minimum quarterly water charge of \$56.60 was approved by Ordinance 4015-13 passed in April, 2013.

Franklin was incorporated on February 21, 1798, one of the original 104 municipalities in New Jersey. (The year was incorrect in the Fall issue).

The repaying of JFK Boulevard was really needed. What an improvement! Any anticipated timing on the repaving of Franklin Boulevard? Franklin Boulevard is a county road. Somerset County bid out the resurfacing, and the work should be completed by the end of this year.

The view is looking toward the Marconi Wireless Station and one of the towers at the wireless station is visible on the left side of the photo. The photograph was taken from the White Farm which was located near today's Easton Avenue and JFK Boulevard.



Family Fun With Geocaching Hunt

The Trails Committee launched the first geocaching treasure hunt October 27. Over 100 participants used maps and GPS devises to find the 28 hidden caches along the trails in the Griggstown Native Grassland Preserve.

In partnership with the Trails Committee, John Neale, president of the North New Jersey Cachers, designed the caches that are related to birds, nature and the history of Griggstown. Those finding the caches record the information, but the hidden items on the trails remain in place for others to discover throughout the year.

Township Land Preservation Consultant Fran Varacalli said, "It was great to see everyone have a good time and to have the opportunity to showcase Franklin's open spaces. Shade Tree Commission Holds Seventh Annual Sale

SPECIAL HURRICANE and SNOWSTORM PRICING

To help replace trees damaged by Sandy, the Shade Tree Commission is again offering trees for spring 2014. This year's flowering trees are the Eastern Redbud and Sweet Bay Magnolia. This year's shade trees are October Glory Red Maple and Zelkova. These are 6-8 foot bare root trees ready for planting. There are only 20 trees of each type available.

Orders are now being taken on a first-come first serve basis. If there is no availability, your check will be returned and you will be notified. All proceeds are used to plant MORE trees in Franklin.

The following 3 conditions apply: 1) all sales are final-no refunds and no guarantees are made or implied; 2) the purchaser or designee must pick up the trees on the given date (trees will fit in most cars); 3) the Shade Tree Commission will not plant your

Eastern Redbud (Cercis canadensis).

The redbud is a native tree with heart-shaped leaves and magenta flower clusters borne on the tree's bare stems in early spring; very showy since the tree's branches are spreading and at optimum conditions the Redbud can grow to 30' tall. Grow in moist but well-drained soil in full-sun or dappled shade. The tree is 5' to 6' high at pick-up.

Sweet Bay Magnolia (Magnolia virginiana) 'Green Shadow'.

Sweet Bay Magnolia is another native tree. This variety is semi-evergreen and will reach approximately 20'-25' in height. It produces 2 1/2" creamy white fragrant flowers sporadically from early June through July. Can be grown in the sun in a variety of soil drainage conditions. The tree is 2.5' to 3.0' high at pick-up.

Type of Shade Trees

October Glory Red Maple

This maple makes an excellent shade tree with glossy, dark green leaves that turn brilliant red in the fall. It grows up to 30' tall & 30 wide in 20 yrs. Will tolerate a wide range of soil conditions, especially moist to wet sites.

Zelkova serrata 'Green Vase'.

This Zelkova has a graceful vase shape with dark green, toothed leaves that turn orange-brown to bronze-red in the fall. It is one of the fastest-growing and strongest shade trees and will grow up to 55' feet tall. The smooth grey bark will peel to reveal orange patches. Grow in moist, well-drained soil in full sun or partial shade.

New Website for Hamilton Street Businesses

Other sections include links to the Franklin Township, Somerset County and Chamber of Commerce web sites and details about the two bus routes that traverse the Business District.

Additionally, current properties for sale or lease within the District are listed. Earlier this year, a Business Recruitment Day was held. Each property for sale or lease was featured, and a tour was organized for those interested in considering the Hamilton Street area for the location or expansion of their business.

Accreditation Ceremony

In February a team of assessors from the New Jersey State Association of Chief's of Police (NJSACOP) examined all aspects of the Franklin Township Police Department's policies, procedures, management, support services and operations as part of the accreditation process. Chief Lawrence W. Roberts stated, "Verification by the team that the Franklin Township Police Department meets the Commission's 'best practice' standards is part of a voluntary process to achieve accreditation, a highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence."

On Tuesday, September 10, 2013 at 7:00 PM, the Franklin Township Police Department had its official accreditation ceremony at the Township Council Meeting. To become an accredited agency the Department needed to demonstrate proof of its compliance with 100 different standards that were set by NJSACOP.

Chief Lawrence W. Roberts said, "Accreditation results in greater accountability within the agency, reduced risk and liability exposure, stronger defense against civil lawsuits, increased community advocacy, and more confidence in the agency's ability to operate efficiently and respond to community needs." He added, "I am very proud of all of the men and women of the Franklin Township Police Department. Reaching the status of becoming an accredited agency was only possible because of their hard work, dedication and professionalism."

The Youth Employment Services (YES) Program

The Franklin Youth Initiative would like residents to be aware of a very valuable service available in Somerset County. The YES Program is funded through the Greater Raritan Workforce Investment Board, and provides intensive case management to youth in need of comprehensive educational and vocational preparation services.

The goal of the program is to eliminate barriers to employment by providing youth with the necessary tools and resources to improve their academic success and employment skills and to develop their leadership skills. Somerset and Hunterdon County youth, ages 16-21, who meet the WIB standard for low income households AND possess one or more risk factors, are eligible to participate. Examples of risk factors include: Basic skills deficient (literacy/ math); School drop-out; Homeless; Runaway; Foster child; Pregnant/Parenting; Involved in the Juvenile Justice or Criminal Justice Systems; and or Disability. Priority is given to veterans, adjudicated youth, and youth who are not enrolled in an educational program at the time of referral.

Franklin Township is starting a new recycling program of soft polyethylene plastic (commonly known as #2 and #4 plastics). These are not currently picked up by Somerset County.

Blue drums will be placed at the Municipal Building, Senior/Community Center, Library, Franklin Park branch of the library, Community Resource and Services at 935 Hamilton, and the Public Works building at 40 Churchill Avenue. Items to be recycled include clean and dry plastics, including grocery bags, newspaper wrappers, dry cleaning bags, furniture, overwrap from toilet paper, napkins and paper towels, shrink wrap from cases of water and soft drink bottles, bubble wrap, and generally all label-free bags marked #2 or #4. A poster at each drum will give further details.

The Township will receive a small payment for the soft plastic it recycles. Some of these plastics are recycled at supermarkets, but the stores are interested in only their own grocery bags. This program will not only recycle many more items, it will also benefit the Township.
