Advisory Committees Play Important Role in Day-to-Day **Workings of Township**

Many dedicated residents volunteer for the committees and commissions that play an important advisory roles that help the Township Council and administration develop policy and make decisions about long-term commitments and day-to-day operations. It takes time and commitment, but seeing results of their efforts makes it worthwhile. Unlike the Planning Board and Board of Adjustment whose members make decisions that become policy, the advisory boards suggest action plans and provide the eyes, ears, and often hands and feet for numerous programs offered by the Township.

Open Space Advisory Committee

The Open Space Advisory Committee consists of 16 members. The Township's Manager, Chief Financial Officer, Planner and Director of Recreation are joined by a member of the Board of Education and 11 members of the public.

The Committee developed an inventory of open space properties, farmland, conservation, recreation and historic sites with the Township. They make recommendations about spending the approximately \$4 million of open space trust funds raised through taxes each year. Part of their time is spent pursuing other funding sources to preserve open space farmland and historical properties, including Somerset County and State of New Jersey.

They are assisted in their role by a paid outside consultant.

Shade Tree Commission

The seven-member Commission advises Township officials and residents on the planting, care and maintenance of trees. This includes advice on the best trees to plant in Franklin Township depending on the need and site conditions. These trees are available to residents through the Commission's annual spring tree sale. The Commission, with the help of the Township's Public Works Department, has planted hundreds of trees on Township-owned property.

Of particular pride is the Commission's application and receipt of the Township's designation as Arbor Day Foundation's Tree City USA. Communities achieve Tree City USA status by maintaining a tree board, having a community tree ordinance, spending at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry, and celebrating Arbor Day.

Trails Advisory Committee

The nine-member committee was established to deal with issues related to trail acquisition, design, maintenance and use.

In 2013 the Committee organized and promoted several programs including the very successful launch of a new Geocache Trail (Geo caching is treasure hunting with a GPS tool), walks through various parks and a photo contest for a 2014 calendar.

Members sponsor and lead walks on the trails and check the trails for damage and vandalism. They initiated an Adopt-a-Trail program to involve citizen volunteers and or volunteer organizations (scout troops, civic organizations, etc.) to adopt a specific trail to periodically walk and inspect and to conduct litter clean-up, debris removal, minor pruning of bushes, and to report any need for additional work.

One of their goals is identifying funds to engineer a North-South trail and establishing a paved path to connect the northern and southern portions of the Township.

Community Gardens Committee (new committee)

The Franklin Township Environmental Commission is seeking volunteers to form a committee to support community gardens in Franklin Township. Two sites, located in Naaman Williams Park and at Pine Grove School, are currently open for public gardening. The committee will support the overall management of the two gardens. This may include coordinating the acceptance of new members, general garden plot maintenance and rules, exchange of gardening information, existing garden expansion and the possible establishment of additional gardens throughout the Township. Gardening experience is a plus but not necessary to become a "Community Garden Committee Member." Historic Preservation Advisory Commission

The Commission has nine members and two alternate members, made up of three categories or classes. Class A members are knowledgeable in building design and construction or architectural history and may reside outside the Township. Class B members are knowledgeable or have a demonstrated interest in local history and may also reside outside the Township. Class C members are required to be residents. Currently, all members of the Commission are Franklin residents.

The Commission members meet regularly to review various applications from residents in the designated historic districts. Recent votes were taken on an application to modify a building to enable its use as a business, the demolition of a garage and the replacement of a roof. They sponsored a recent program on "Windows and Roofs, Preserving Historic Character." Several of the Township's historic structures have been stabilized through grants obtained by the Commission. They work closely with the Open Space Committee, with each board having a member of other board sitting as an active member.

One recent project completed by the Commission was the inventory of the historic structures in the Township.

On-Line Payments

OPTION 1: On-line payments. Links are on the Revenue Department's web page, http://www. franklintwpnj.org/dept_revenue_collection1.html. There are fees of 2.9% for payments by credit cards and \$1.00 for ACH payments. There is no charge to review or print your statement on line.

OPTION 2: On-line payments through bank's websites. These are not electronic transactions and checks still are mailed. It is important to allow enough time for mailing in order to avoid late payments.

Reassessment Program Underway

As part of the 2015 Reassessment program, representatives from the Township's Tax Assessors office have begun visiting properties throughout selected areas of the Township. In order to develop a fair and accurate assessment, it is important that both the interior and exterior of each structure be inspected. Residents should ask to see the field inspector's Township-issued identification before letting anyone into their home.

The 2014 assessment notification postcards have recently been mailed to all property owners. It is important to carefully check the notice which shows your 2014 tax assessment, as well as the prior year's assessment. If for some reason you disagree with the assessed value shown, you have the right to file a tax assessment appeal with the Somerset County Board of Taxation. Instructions on how to file an appeal are included on the postcard. Assessment appeals must be filed prior to May 1, 2014.

Frequently Asked **Questions?**

Do all traffic accidents have to be reported?

Motor vehicle crashes that occur in Franklin Township should be reported to the Police Department immediately via 9-1-1 or the non-emergency number (732)873-2300. Officers will respond to the scene and collect the information necessary for the report. There are several issues with not reporting a crash. If you and the other driver "exchange information and agree to work it out," you take the risk of the other driver reneging on the deal. Additionally, if the other person reports the crash, you could be charged with failure to report a motor vehicle crash and leaving the scene of a motor vehicle crash.

The Township did a great job in keeping up with the roads during the cold and snow. How much did the Township pay for 2013-2014 season in ice control products?

The amount ordered at the time the Franklin Times went to press was \$171,301.98. This included the salt ordered in the fall in preparation for the coming 2013-2014 winter season. The Township's 750- ton salt dome is considered by some too small for the 230 miles of public roads the Township must maintain during the year. It would take approximately 400 tons of salt to cover all the roads in a storm. Due to the salt shortage this past season, only 150 tons per storm were applied to the main roads and emergency areas.

Where do we report when there is a pothole?

Depends on its location.



The Frederick Douglass Library Collection

The Franklin Township Public Library houses several special collections. One of the oldest is the Frederick Douglass Collection. The history of this collection can be traced back to 1979 when a fire destroyed the Frederick Douglass Liberation Library on Fuller Street. After the fire, the Library Board decided to use the insurance settlement funds as seed money for a new collection of African-American literature. Accordingly, in 1983 the Frederick Douglass Collection officially opened. During the next 31 years, the subject matter was expanded to include all aspects of African-American history and culture. The number of materials in the collection as a whole has grown steadily, reaching almost 5,200 titles in early 2014. Materials with the FDC or African-American designations include non-fiction works on African-American studies and fiction titles written by African-Americans. Print and audio-visual titles, monographs and periodicals are represented in various locations throughout the library.

'Local' Ethics Board **Makes Move to Trenton**

In December of 2013 the Township Council voted to pass the responsibility of adjudicating ethics violations to the state agency call the "Local Finance Board" in Trenton. The Local Finance Board is so named because it deals with local finance issues and not because of its location.

An advantage to this move is there is no longer a cost to the Township, and the state board has the office of the Attorney General and subpoena power at its disposal. The disadvantage is the thought of having to deal with Trenton may make the process seem more daunting and dissuade an individual from filing a complaint. The purpose of this article is make the process of filing a complaint seem less intimidating. This article will cover the basics but more complete coverage of the topic can be found on the Township web site under "I WANT TO ... / File / Ethics Complaint." This article is to be used as a guide and is not a substitute for the full law.

If you do a web search for N.J.S.A. 40A: 9-22.1 you will find the complete ethics law and will learn the law does not deal with ethics per say, it is really about conflict of interest. In brief, it says if you are an official you can't be in a business that interferes with your government job nor can you award a bid to someone who just left the government or give a government job/bid/loan/ gift/favor/service/etc. to your business, self or a family member. Finally, no local government officer or employee shall use or attempt to use their official position to secure unwarranted privileges or advantages for themselves or others. In short, one is in violation of the law if they use the power of government to improperly benefit themselves or others.

The law applies to elected, appointed, hired, paid, volunteer and unpaid officials. That means members of the Council, fire companies, Planning and Zoning boards and all other voluntary committees, commissions and boards. It expressly excludes members of the school district who are covered under a separate law.

If you have an ethics complaint, please go to the Township website to learn more. Your complaint should include the person(s) and title(s) of those involved and how you believe they violated the law. Present the facts. Explain the relationship between the official and anyone who benefited from the action. Then send your signed complaint in writing to:

The Local Ethics board then has 30 days to acknowledge receipt of your complaint.

Officers from as far away as California will depart from the Police Department on DeMott Lane on May 10, with TEAM FRANKLIN leading the way. They will reach Washington in time for the May 13 candlelight vigil at the Memorial where the names of the officers who have died in the line of duty in 2013 will be read.

The primary purpose of the Tour is to raise awareness about the officers who gave their lives in the line of duty and provide support for their families. The tour also raises funds for the Memorial.



Don't make "The Big Mistake" Understand the Facts & Laws Regarding Underage Drinking

As prom and graduation season approaches, the Franklin Township Municipal Alliance for the Prevention of Substance Abuse (FTMAPSA) wants to remind parents about the price they will have to pay for their child's under-aged dinking. Drinking alcohol under the age of 21 is illegal in New Jersey and will result in a \$500 fine, community service and loss of one's driver's license. Moreover, it is also a disorderly person's offense for adults to provide alcohol to any person under the age of 21, other than their own child in the privacy of their own home, i.e. a parent may give his or her children alcohol in their home for a religious occasion. The penalties for an adult providing alcohol to their children's under aged friends is a fine of up to \$1,000 and/or up to six months imprisonment.

Things parents can do to prevent the worst: If your child is going to a party, find out where it is and call other parents to make sure it will be alcohol free; keep your alcohol

locked up your so your child won't have access to it; check back packs and purses at the door to make sure no alcoholic beverages are entering your home in the hands of teenagers; refuse to buy alcohol for your child or host a party where persons under 21 consume alcohol.

Build-a- Rain Barrel Workshop: Saturday, May 3

Spring is here!

Come out and bring the family to a Build-a-Rain Barrel Workshop! Join the Franklin Township Environmental Commission (FTEC) and the New Jersey Water Supply Authority (NJWSA) at the municipal building on Saturday May 3, from 9am-12pm. Rain barrels collect and store rainwater collected from a roof. The water can be used to water lawns and gardens or be used for other non-potable (non-drinkable) uses. Residents can reduce their potable water usage, save money on water bills and reduce stress on wells by using a rain barrel. By collecting the rainwater, the volume of water reaching local waterbodies is reduced, which can help improve stream health.

Learn how using a rain barrel can help you contribute to improving water resources. Participants will learn how to build, install, and maintain their own rain barrel.

"In addition to conserving water, rain barrels help the environment by reducing the amount of runoff going to our storm sewers and rivers during rain storms, easing stream erosion. Installing a rain barrel is one of the best ways homeowners can help to manage the effects of urban stormwater" said NJWSA staff member Kathy Hale.

Is Your Burglar Alarm Registered?

Recently there have been several questions regarding home and commercial alarm systems. Below are answers to some of the most commonly-received questions.

Why do I have to register my alarm?

Registration ensures that the Police Department has accurate contact information in the event of an alarm activation or problem at the home or business. Ordinance 85-3 was adopted on October 14, 1997 and states, "Any person utilizing an alarm system shall complete and file with the Chief of Police a registration form, which may be obtained from the Police Department, correctly containing the following information: (1) Full name, address, and telephone number of the applicant, including the address description which will permit the appropriate municipal department to respond to the alarm."

Who is responsible for registering my alarm?

The ultimate responsibility rests with the person having the alarm installed. Sometimes installers register the alarm: but it is a good idea to double check to make sure the registration is complete. New homeowners are required to reregister the alarm in their name. The registration is tied to the owner...not the house.

How do I know if my alarm is registered?

How do I get my alarm registered?

There is a one-time registration fee of \$25 for residential alarm and \$50 for commercial alarms, as outlined in Ordinance 85-12. Registration forms are available at the Police Department on or the Township website, www. franklintwpnj.org. On the bar close to the top of the page, click on Government, then Police, then Alarm Registration – Download Form. There are instructions on how to make out checks, the cost of registration, and mailing directions.

What will happen if I don't register my alarm and the alarm goes off and the Police come to my home?

- A letter will be sent, giving the opportunity to submit the registration form and pay the \$25 registration fee.
- If the alarm isn't registered within 20 days of the written notice, a summons will be issued requiring a court appearance, court costs and potentially a fine.

Once I am registered, are there fines for false alarms?

The Police Departments responds to every alarm call that is received by a central monitoring company. Once officers are en route, protocols do not allow them to be cancelled. Last year the Police responded to over 4,500 false alarm calls, accounting for approximately 15% of all calls handled by officers. A malfunctioning alarm can account for a great many staff hours that could be spent on other emergencies and proactive-type patrols. This reinforces the need for the Police to have valid contact information. If the Police can contact the homeowner or business when the alarm sounds, it may free the officers for other emergency calls, as well as save a costly fine charged for false alarms.

- A first warning will be issued after the 3rd false alarm in any given calendar year.
- A fine of \$50 plus a court fee of \$15 after the 4th false alarm in the same calendar year.
- A fine of \$75 plus a court fee of \$15 after the 5th, 6th and 7th false alarm in the same calendar year.
- A fine of \$100 plus a court fee of \$15 for the 8th and any subsequent false alarms in the same calendar year.

TOWNSHIP NOW RECYCLES SOFT PLASTIC

Franklin Township started a new recycling program of soft polyethylene plastic (commonly known as #2 and #4 plastics). These are not currently picked up by Somerset County.

Blue drums are located in the Municipal Building, Senior/Community Center, Library, Franklin Park branch of the library, Community Resource and Services at 935 Hamilton, and the Public Works building at 40 Churchill Avenue. Items to be recycled include CLEAN and DRY PLASTICS, including grocery bags, newspaper wrappers, dry cleaning bags, overwrap from toilet paper, napkins and paper towels, shrink wrap from cases of water and soft drink bottles, bubble wrap, and generally all label-free bags marked #2 or #4.

Some of these plastics are recycled at supermarkets, but the stores are interested in only their own grocery bags.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING TO BE REVAMPED 'Single Stream' Program Aims to Increase Recycling Volumes

Somerset County will be introducing a new single-container approach to curbside recycling. Residents will receive a new, larger wheeled recycling cart for the collection of both paper and commingled materials. "Single stream" means that paper items can be mixed with bottles and cans in the same container. Newspaper and cardboard boxes do not have to be tied.

The program, piloted in several other Somerset County communities, has resulted in an increase in the recycling volumes. The increased recycling tonnage enables the county to obtain grant money to enhance the recycling program.
