



## FRANKLIN'S **MASTER PLAN**



The Municipal Land Use Law, (N.J.S.A. 40:55D) establishes the legal criteria for a Master Plan for each community. The responsibility for the preparation of a Master Plan rests with the local Planning Board and must be reviewed at least once every ten years. The Plan has several elements, including:

- 1. Community profile
- 2. Lane use plan
- Circulation plan
- Community facilities plan
- Parks and recreation plan
- Conservation plan
- Historic preservation plan
- 8. Utility plan
- Housing element
- 10. Economic plan
- 11. Recycling plan
- 12. Relationship in other planning efforts (in neighboring communities, the county and state)

Franklin's Master Plan was last updated in March, 2006. It is now time for the Planning Board to review the Plan. The new Master Plan will address:

- 1. The major problems and objectives relating to land development at the time of the adoption of the last
- 2. The extent to which such problems and objectives have been reduced or increased;
- 3. The extend of the changes in the Township's density, distribution of population and land uses;
- 4. The changes recommended for the Master Plan.

Input from the public is essential for the Planning Board to conduct its review of the Master Plan. The process is lengthly and could take up to one year. There will be numerous meetings throughout the process, enabling residents to give input to the Board. In addition, a webpage dedicated to the Master Plan will be provided on the Township website so that residents can review plan-related documents as they are being reviewed by the Board.

#### What You Need to Know About Measles

You may be hearing a lot about measles lately, and all of this news on TV, social media, Internet, newspapers and magazines may leave you wondering what you as a parent really need to know about this disease. In partnership with the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Somerset County Department of Health has put together a list of the most important facts about measles for parents like you.

#### 1. Measles can be serious.

Some people think of measles as just a little rash and fever that clears up in a few days, but measles can cause serious health complications, especially in children younger than five years of age. There is no way to tell in advance the severity of the symptoms your child will experience.

- About 1 in 4 people in the U.S. who get measles will be hospi-
- 1 out of every 1,000 people with measles will develop brain swelling, which could lead to brain damage.
- 1 or 2 out of 1,000 people with measles will die, even with the

Some of the more common measles symptoms include:

Fever • Rash • Runny nose • Red eyes

#### 2. Measles is very contagious.

Measles spreads through the air when an infected person coughs or sneezes. It is so contagious that if one person has it, 9 out of 10 people around him or her will also become infected if they are not protected. Your child can get measles just by being in a room where a person with measles has been, even up to two hours after that person has left. An infected person can spread measles to others even before knowing he/she has the disease—from four days before developing the measles rash through four days afterward.

#### 3. Your child can still get measles in United States.

Measles was declared eliminated from the U.S. in 2000 thanks to a highly effective vaccination program. Eliminated means that the disease is no longer constantly present in this country. However, measles is still common in many parts of the world, including some countries in Europe, Asia, the Pacific, and Africa. Worldwide, an estimated 20 million people get measles and 146,000 people, mostly children, die from the disease each year.

Even if your family does not travel internationally, you could come into contact with measles anywhere in your community. Every year, measles is brought into the United States by unvaccinated travelers (Americans or foreign visitors) who get measles while they are in other countries. Anyone who is not protected against measles is at risk.

#### 4. You have the power to protect your child against measles with a safe and effective vaccine.

The best protection against measles is measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine. MMR vaccine provides long-lasting protection against all strains of measles. Your child needs two doses of MMR vaccine for best protection:

- The first dose at 12 through 15 months of age
- The second dose 4 through 6 years of age

If your family is traveling overseas, the vaccine recommendations are a little different:

- If your baby is 6 through 11 months old, he or she should receive 1 dose of MMR vaccine before leaving.
- If your child is 12 months of age or older, he or she will need 2 doses of MMR vaccine (separated by at least 28 days) before departure.

If you are uninsured, and your child needs vaccinations, Somerset County Department of Health can help. We work with the Community Visiting Nurse Association to provide free vaccinations to uninsured children in Franklin Township. CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FRANKLIN

CHAPTER 183

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

ARTICLE IV

CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED BUILDING COMPLIANCE

§ 183-19. Certificate of Continued Building Compliance

- A. No owner, agent, realtor or broker, firm, company, partnership, corporation, or any other person shall sell, rent, re-rent, transfer, lease, let, mortgage with right of occupancy, allow re-occupancy, or otherwise dispose of ownership any structure or dwelling unit until either a Certificate of Continued Building Compliance or a Temporary Certificate of Continued Building Compliance has been issued by the Township; and until the Township Water Department has been notified of such change and/or a new water meter has been set. Changes of occupancy in multi-family dwellings shall be exempt from this requirement, as they are subject to Chapter 151 of the Code of Franklin Township.
  - 1. In the event of a resale of a structure in an "as is" condition, a Certificate of non-compliance shall be issued to allow the transfer of title with full disclosure to all parties. No occupancy shall be allowed until structure meets the life safety requirements in effect at the time the structure was built as well as any code or retrofit requirements that may affect the particular structure.
  - The owner or the owner's agent shall schedule an Inspection for Certificate of Continued Building Compliance no later than ten (10) business days prior to the date of the closing or change of tenant.

#### PLEASE NOTE:

The Code Enforcement Official may levy fines of up to \$2,000.00 per day, per offense for violations of this chapter and/or for noncompliance with orders or notices.

What happened to the 'single stream' program with the big sample containers that were in the municipal building lobby? Weren't they suppose to replace the current curbside recycling program?

Curbside recycling is administered by Somerset County, who solicited bids from vendors to provide the service to Franklin residents. No bids were received. As the Franklin Times goes to print, there is no further news from the County and, for now, recycling will continue in its present form.

#### Why do you repeat storm drainage and flooding articles in the newsletter each year?

Publication of these articles is a requirement of our NJDEP-issued MS4 Stormwater Discharge Permit and FEMA's CRS program. The articles not only provide valuable information, they help the Township keep in permit compliance and count toward a program which provides residents substantial savings in flood insurance premiums.

#### My contractor is waiting for a permit. How long do we have to wait for permits to be issued and for each inspection?

The Construction Department has to review permit applications within twenty business days from the date of submission into the "Construction Department. Field inspections are to be done within 3 business days after the request. By the way, there were over 4,000 permits issued last year. Permit fees are set by the State of New Jersey and based on the estimate of the cost of construction.

### **Township Proudly Announces Workers' Safety Numbers**

Franklin Township had a total of only five workers compensation claims with lost time for 2014, the lowest number of all the ten municipalities in the Central Jersey Joint Insurance Fund.



#### **Guard Duty at Marconi Wireless Station -- March 13, 1942**

Franklin Township Police Officer Joseph Lupo guards the entrance to the Radio Corporation of America (R.C.A.) facility on Easton Avenue in Franklin Township during World War II. The Marconi Wireless Telegraph Company of America began construction of this facility in 1913, and it was known as the New Brunswick Marconi Wireless Station in its early days.

The station's powerful antenna consisted of a bronze cable supported by tubular steel masts and strung 440 feet above the ground. The cable stretched for a mile along the Delaware and Raritan Canal. Two of the most important transatlantic wireless telegraphy messages of World War I were transmitted from the station: Woodrow Wilson's historic Fourteen Points statement of January 8, 1918, and Wilson's appeal to the Germany people calling for the abdication or overthrow of Kaiser Wilhelm II in October 1918.

## **Police** Reintroduce P.A.C.E.R. **Program**

The Franklin Township Police Department, in conjunction with the Franklin Township Board of Education, has reintroduced the P.A.C.E.R. Program at the Pine Grove Manor School. Officers from the Department will again be going to the school to read to the children and answer any questions the children have about the officers and what they do.

The nationally-recognized, awardwinning program was interrupted in 2003 due to budget cutbacks. But the positive effect of the program and lasting positive effect prompted the Police to reintroduce the program. The children see the officers in a different light and it gains important community support for the police department.







### It's 21 for a Reason **Understand the Facts & Laws Regarding Underage Drinking**


As Prom and Graduation season approaches the Franklin Township Municipal Alliance for the Prevention of Substance Abuse (FTMAPSA) wants to remind parents about the price they will have to pay for their child's under-aged dinking. Drinking alcohol under the age of 21 is illegal in New Jersey and will result in a \$500 fine, community service and loss of one's driver's license. Moreover, it is also a disorderly person's offense for adults to provide alcohol to any person under the age of 21, other than their own child in the privacy of their own home, i.e. a parent may give his or her children alcohol in their home for a religious occasion. The penalties for an adult providing alcohol to their children's under aged friends is a fine of up to \$1,000 and/ or up to six months imprisonment.

Things parents can do to prevent the worst: If your child is going to a party, find out where it is and call other parents to make sure it will be alcohol free; Keep your alcohol locked up your so that your child won't have access to it; Check back packs and purses at the door to make sure no alcoholic beverages are entering your home in the hands of teenagers; Refuse to buy alcohol for your child, or host a party where persons under 21 consume alcohol.

Through the "Parents Who Host, Lose The Most" Campaign, the Franklin Township Municipal Alliance for the Prevention of Substance Abuse wants to encourage parents and the community to send a unified message that teen alcohol consumption is not acceptable. We have a responsibility to help youth realize that alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs are not necessary to enjoy activities or to show independence. By being positive role models and working together during this exciting point in teens' lives, we will ensure that we are making only positive marks on the pages of their lives. A clear community wide message with support, responsibility, positive role models, alterna-

## **Build-a- Rain Barrel Workshop: Saturday, April 25**

#### Spring is here!

Come on out and bring the family to a Build-a-Rain Barrel Workshop! Please join the Franklin Township Environmental Commission (FTEC) and the New Jersey Water Supply Authority (NJWSA) at the municipal building on Saturday April 25, from 9am-11am.

Rain barrels collect and store rainwater collected from a roof. The water can be used to water lawns and gardens or be used for other non-potable (non-drinkable) uses. By using a rain barrel, residents can reduce their potable water usage and save money on water bills and reduce stress on wells. By collecting the rainwater, the volume of water reaching local waterbodies is reduced, which can help improve stream health.

Staff from NJWSA will discuss how the benefits of rain barrels and how residents can contribute to improving water resources. They will then show participants how to build, install, and maintain their own rain barrel, which will collect water from residential roofs during rain storms.

"In addition to conserving water, rain barrels help the environment by reducing the amount of runoff going to our storm sewers and rivers during rain storms, easing stream erosion. Installing a rain barrel is one of the best ways homeowners can help to manage the effects of urban stormwater" said NJWSA staff member Kathy Hale.

The workshop is open to all Franklin Township residents and is free to attend. If you would like to build and take home a rain barrel, the cost is \$35. ## Invasive Species Strike Team Seminar in Franklin Township May 4, 2015

The Franklin Township Environmental Commission is pleased to have Susan Brookman, Executive Director of the NJ Invasive Species Strike Team, give a presentation about Invasive Species in the Municipal Council chambers on May 4 at 7 p.m.

The Invasive Species Strike Team works to stop the spread of new invasive species – plants, animals, pathogens and other organisms that are not native to New Jersey whose presence is likely to damage the health of our environment, economy or our citizens. Ms. Brookman will discuss detecting invasive species early as the key to successful control. If an invasive species is detected soon after it arrives, we have a chance to nip it in the bud and keep it from establishing a viable population in New Jersey.

Ms. Brookman will share information about the status of invasive species in New Jersey and will discuss how people with smartphones can learn about, identify and report invasive species with an app that has been developed. She will demonstrate how a new smartphone app works - a user who sees something they suspect may be an invasive species can scroll through photos to identify what they see, read information about it, then take a picture and submit a report. She will share how when invasive species are detected, the Strike Team can offer guidance to property owners to help them eradicate the problem species.

The Strike Team works with counterparts across the mid-Atlantic to catalog non-native species and assess their threat levels. It creates an annual list of target species – the list this year includes 88 plants, 35 animals and 5 pathogens – and then encourages conservationists and outdoor enthusiasts to be on the lookout for them.

All interested members of the public are invited to attend and participate, including asking questions.

# SHADE TREE COMMISSION SPRING TREE SALE EXTENDED WITH MORE TREES AVAILABLE

The Shade Tree Commission is proud to announce a new order limit and deadline. Residents may now purchase up to 6 trees maximum. Orders <u>must</u> be placed by April 8, 2015. All proceeds are used to plant trees in the Township's parks, public lands and rights-of-way.

### **Reassessment Program Underway**

As part of the 2016 Reassessment program, representatives from the Township's Tax Assessors office have begun visiting properties throughout selected areas of the township. In order to develop a fair and accurate assessment, it is important that each structure be inspected both interior and exterior. Residents should ask to see the field inspector's Township-issued identification before letting anyone into their home.

The 2015 assessment notification postcards have recently been mailed to all property owners. It is important to carefully check the notice which shows your 2015 tax assessment, as well as the prior year's assessment. If for some reason you disagree with the assessed value shown, you have the right to file a tax assessment appeal with the Somerset County Board of Taxation. Instructions on how to file an appeal are included on the postcard. Assessment appeals must be filed prior to May 1, 2015.

## FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP YOUTH COUNCIL RECOGNIZED WITH STATE AWARD

On Tuesday, March 11, 2015, Saffie Kallon, Recreation Program Coordinator for Franklin and the Coordinator for the Franklin Township Youth Council accepted the Annual Award for Excellence in Cultural Arts Programming from the New Jersey Recreation and Parks Association.

The Franklin Township Parks & Recreation Department has spearheaded the Franklin Township Municipal Alliance for the Prevention of Substance Abuse and the Youth Services Commission (FTYSC) prevention initiatives for over 20 years. These programs have been the key to some of the Recreation Departments non-traditional programming. They have fostered the development of the Franklin Township Youth Council, a community service youth group under the direction of the Recreation Department, which was tasked with creating several public service announcements (PSAs) to address the burgeoning problem of nicotine, heroin, underage drinking, prescription drug abuse and bullying. The Franklin Township Youth Council is currently comprised of more than 100 teens in grades 7-12. With a subcommittee structure, Youth Council is challenged with creating and volunteering in a variety of programs that address numerous areas of youth, teen and community concern and interest.

The Health and Wellness Committee was challenged with creating powerful messages that would effectively demonstrate the dangers of substance abuse and adolescent issues and would be impactful to teens and pre-teens. Youth Council has produced five videos which have included, preparing scripts, securing actors, and coordinating the filming and production with an independent videographer. The videos have been brought to life and used to educate their peers. The PSA's allow Franklin's Teens to identify with individuals of the same age and with the struggle of those on the screen. Parent awareness was also increased as to the reality of issues that could have a direct impact on their family.

Congratulations to all the partners that contributed to the success of this community service awareness project.


## **Franklin Honored as a NJ Smart Workplaces**

## Ordinance Encourages Smart Use of A Most Valuable Asset--Water

Last fall, the Township Council passed an ordinance (4077-14) for water conservation during non-emergency periods as well as during drought emergencies. It applies to the outside use of water, mainly lawn watering, for the purpose of encouraging water conservation so more water will be available in a period of drought.

Most of this ordinance is only advisory, especially for residents served by the municipal water system. It is mandatory for residents on small lots (less than an acre in areas zoned for half-acre or smaller lots) who draw their water from wells, because of the possibility of affecting their neighbors' wells by using too much water. Everyone is urged – or, for those on small lots, required – to water only two days a week, preferably before 9 a.m. or after 5 p.m., not more than 30 minutes per day on any one area of lawn. Lawns should not be watered while it is raining; automatic systems should have a rain sensor which shuts off watering when 1/4 inch of rain has fallen.

Vehicles, decks and driveways may be washed on any day, but only with a power washer or hand held hose equipped with an automatic shut-off, so that the water runs only when one is actually washing, not when the hose is laid down.

Exempted are: use of water from rain barrels, 'gray' water or reclaimed water; watering of community gardens, commercial farms, nurseries, sod farms and golf courses (which generally use only as much water as necessary); watering after application of chemicals, or for establishment of new lawns (21 days after seeding or sodding). Flowers and shrubs may be watered as needed with a watering can, a drip system, or a hose with an automatic shut-off device.

We won't have a 'water police,' but those in small lot areas who over-water may expect a visit from a representative of the Township, who will warn them that they have been reported as exceeding what the ordinance allows. Further violations can result in fines.
