Council Meetings—Their Role in Governing Life in Franklin Faulkner Act/Council-Manager Plan



Franklin Township operates under the Council-Manager Plan, just one of several types of government in the Optional Municipal Charter Act, more commonly known as the Faulkner Act (N.J.S.A. 40:69A-1).

In the Council-Manager Plan, Franklin is governed by eight elected council members, one for each of Franklin's five wards, and three atlarge members. The terms are four years, with elections staggered every two years.

The Mayor is the ninth member of the council, and is elected by the voters for a four-year term. The Mayor presides at all meetings of the Council, and has a voice and vote in its proceedings, and executes contracts on behalf of the municipality.

All powers of the municipality and the determination of all matters of policy are vested in the Council. The Council appoints a municipal Manager and a Municipal Clerk, as well as the municipal attorney and members of various municipal boards. The Council acts as a body, and its members cannot seek individually to influence the official acts of the municipal Manager or other employees.

Open Public Meetings Act

The 1975 Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, sometimes known as the Sunshine Law, establishes the right of all citizens to have adequate advance notice of all public meetings, and the right to attend meetings at which any business affecting the public is discussed or acted upon

Meeting notices must be posted in a public place and forwarded to all official newspapers at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting. The annual meeting schedules for the Township Council and Planning and Zoning boards are sent at the first of the year to all official newspapers.

While the Sunshine Law allows government boards to exclude the public under nine specific circumstances, all votes must be in public. The subject matter which may require conferring in private session include:

- 1. Anything ruled "confidential;"
- 2. Matters that could damage the ability to receive federal funds;
- 3. Material that could invade an individual's privacy;
- 4. Collective bargaining agreements or negotiations;
- 5. The purchase, lease or acquisition of property with public funds;
- 6. Public safety strategies when disclosure would undermine those plans;
- 7. Pending or anticipated litigation;
- 8. Employment or worker discipline matters; and
- 9. Deliberations that may result in someone being fined or losing a license.

Anatomy of a Township Council Meeting

Besides approving the warrants (Township's bills) and previous meetings' minutes, the Township Council meeting provides an opportunity for the public to address the members of the Council on any matter.

Agenda Items

The tentative agenda is posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building the Friday before a meeting. It is also posted on the Township's website. You may also call the Township's Clerk's office for a copy of an agenda, or for information about an upcoming agenda, at 732-873-2500, ext. 6208.

The Township Council may use the meeting to issue proclamations and commendations to recognize and honor special people and events. Reports from officials and committees are given at the meeting. A very important part of each meeting is the discussion and vote on resolutions and ordinances affecting the business of the Township.

Ordinance vs. Resolution

An ordinance includes any act or regulation of the governing body required to be reduced to writing, and read at more than one meeting and published. The multiple purposes for which ordinances can be adopted are provided in the state statute N.J.S.A. 40:48-1, and include, among other things, items related to finances and property, building regulations, officers and employees, and fees. It takes several weeks for an ordinance to take effect.

Meeting 1: Introduce the ordinance; advertise in the official newspaper (Courier News)

Meeting 2: Public hearing and vote; advertise in the official newspaper (Courier News)

Effective Date: 20 days after the second publication in the newspaper

A resolution is any act or regulation of the governing body that is required to be reduced to writing and has the same effect as an ordinance, but the effective date is immediate.

Meeting 1: First and only reading; vote; effective immediately.

Copies of all ordinances scheduled for public hearing are posted on the bulletin board in the main lobby of the Municipal Building. Ordinances and resolutions are linked to agendas posted on the Township website, www.franklintwpnj.org. They are also available at the meeting.

Consent Agenda

Consent agendas consist of grouped action items. They provide rapid, effective action on routine, non-controversial matters needing no discussion. Some examples include the approval of routine licenses, receipt of routing reports, and award of contracts. Any item on the consent agenda can be moved as a separate discussion item prior to the Council members voting.

Public Discussion

The public can speak at any public meeting during the "public discussion" portion of the meeting on any item of concern.

Township Council Meeting Schedules

The Township Council meets on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Tuesday of each month, except in July, August and December, when they meet only on the 2^{nd} Tuesday. Meetings begin at 7 p.m. in the Municipal Building, and are broadcast live on Comcast Channel 25 and Verizon Channel 33. They are also rebroadcast on the cable channels and on the Township website, <u>www.franklintwpnj.org</u>. Also available on the website are the agendas and minutes of each meeting.

For 2016, we are proud to offer a variety of trees, including two new varieties, as well the previously-sold favorites. There will be a limit of two trees per variety, a March 15th deadline, and uniform pricing. All proceeds are used to plant trees in the Township's parks, public lands, and right-of-ways.

Temporary parking handicapped permits are available at the Police Department. Long-term handicapped permit applications are available from the state Division of Motor Vehicles. The fine for parking in a handicapped parking space is \$250.

Bollywood in Franklin

Did you know that Bollywood is at the Franklin Township Public Library? Due to the growing interest in Indian literature and culture, the library has been continuing to add Bollywood movies to its entertainment movie collection.

What is Bollywood? It is a nickname for the prolific Indian movie industry that releases over a thousand movies a year. Historically, the Indian movie industry took shape about the same time as America's. The first Indian silent feature, Raja Harishchanra, which explored Hindu Mythology, was released in 1913.

One of the most noticeable features of Indian cinema is that the actors regularly burst into song, and even into complex musical numbers that can feature hundreds of dancers. Early movies might have had anywhere up to 40 songs or musical numbers per film. More recent movies, however, have scaled down these musical numbers to seven or eight. These songs often become very popular, and are often played at weddings. Overall, Bollywood movies are visual feasts with elaborate costumes and large studio sets. Their stars are versatile and talented actors with devoted fans around the word.

In the past, the majority of Bollywood movies offered pure escapism. The most popular of these was romance, whether a romantic comedy or an epic romance. With the growth of the popularity of Indian cinema and the increasing sophistication of its viewers, newer movies offer more than an escape. Other themes, such as political activism, have emerged. Residents are encouraged to visit the library and check out these interesting movies for themselves.

FLOOD RISKS – Are you Ready?

Flooding in Franklin Township is caused by a number of sources. The Millstone River, Raritan River, Six Mile Run and the Delaware & Raritan Canal can leave their banks during heavy rain storms. Smaller streams prone to flooding include Ten Mile Run, Nine Mile Run, Carter's Brook, Simonson Brook, Cedar Grove Brook, Seeley's Brook, and Randolph Brook. However, even if you don't live near one of these watercourses, you still may be at risk from flooding.

The extensive damage caused by Hurricane Irene, Tropical Storm Lee and the winter storm of 2011 are still on the minds of residents. Other recent storm events include Tropical Storm Floyd in 1999 and the spring storms of 2007, 2010 and 2014. Besides these newsmakers, localized flooding also takes place throughout the Township during heavy rain events. Just because your property has not been flooded recently, it can still be flooded in the future because of differing sets of circumstances at work such as frozen or saturated soils, storm duration and intensity. Nearly 25% of flood insurance claims come from moderate-to-low flood risk areas.

Township Flood Services: The first thing you should do is check your flood hazard. Flood maps and flood protection references are available from the Franklin Township Public Library or the Engineering Department to see if you are in a mapped flood plain. If so, they can give you more information, such as base flood elevations, floodway information, past flood problems in the area, and copies of Elevation Certificates, if on file.

The Engineering Department can answer your specific questions or can perform a site visit to review your surface flooding problem and explain ways to stop flooding or prevent flood damage. They are available from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. or can be reached at (732) 873-2500 ext. 6230.

What You Can Do: Your cooperation and assistance is vital in the Township's efforts to help prevent flooding. Here are some things you can do to help:

- Do not dump or throw anything into ditches, swales or streams. Even grass clippings and branches can accumulate and plug channels. Every piece of trash contributes to flooding.
- If your property is next to a ditch, swale or stream, please do your part and keep the banks clear of brush and debris. Public Works removes major blockages such as fallen trees from Township owned or maintained drainage ways. Other drainage ways may either be owned privately, by other government agencies, or by a homeowners associa-
- If you see debris in drainage ways maintained by the Township, contact Public Works at (732) 249-7800.
- Always check with the Zoning and Construction Departments prior to building on your property as permits may be necessary. Contact the Engineering Department before you clear, fill, remove soil or re-grade your property.
- If you see construction without a permit sign posted, contact the Construction Department at (732) 873-2500 ext. 6220. If you see grading or tree removal on a property, contact the Engineering Department to confirm that the proper permits were

Flood Protection: There are several ways to protect a building from flood damage. For buildings constructed within the floodplain; flood walls, earthen berms, waterproofing of walls and installation of watertight closures over doorways are some options as well as moving and/ or raising the elevation of the structure. If your building is constructed within the actual floodplain, we recommend that you contact either the Engineering or Construction Department for specific help and recommendations.

Don't wait for the next flood to buy insurance protection. There is a 30-day waiting period before National Flood Insurance Program coverage takes effect. Contact your insurance agent for more information on rates and coverage.

Some houses, even those not in the floodplain, have sewers that back up into the basement during heavy rains. If you are concerned with sewer backups, you may wish to contact a plumber about installing a backup valve. A plumbing permit would need to be obtained.

If you know that a flood is coming, you should shut off gas and electricity and move valuable contents upstairs. Fire is one of the major causes of damage in floods. It is recommended that you make a detailed checklist in advance in order to be properly prepared.

Flood Insurance: If you do not have flood insurance, talk to your insurance agent. *Homeowner's insurance policies do* not cover damage from floods. However, because Franklin Township participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, you can purchase a separate flood insurance policy. This insurance is backed by the Federal government and is available to everyone, even for properties that have previously flooded.

For properties with little or no flood loss history, there is a low-cost Preferred Risk Policy (PRP) available. For a much lower cost than a Standard Flood Insurance Policy, lower risk homeowners can insure themselves against losses. For more information on how to qualify for a Preferred Risk Policy, homeowners can call FEMA's Flood Insurance Hotline at 1-800-427-4661 or speak directly with their local insurance agent.

Another valuable resource is FEMA's www.floodsmart.gov website. By simply entering your address, you can get a rating of your flood risk, an estimate of flood insurance premiums and a list of nearby insurance agents.

Some people have purchased flood insurance because it was required by the bank when they got a mortgage or home improvement loan. Usually these policies just cover the building's structure and not the contents. There is usually much more damage done to the furniture and other building contents than there is to the actual structure.

If your flooding problem is caused by sewer backup, you may wish to speak to your insurance agent about a sewer backup rider to homeowner's insurance policy.

FLOOD SAFETY

Do not walk through flowing water. Drowning is the number one cause of flood deaths. Six inches of moving water can knock you off your feet.

Do not drive through a flooded area. More people drown in their cars than anywhere else.

Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. Report downed power lines to the power company.

Have your electricity turned off by the power company. Some appliances, such as televisions, keep electrical charges even after they have been unplugged. Don't use appliances or motors that have gotten wet unless they have been taken apart, cleaned and dried.

Look out for animals, especially snakes. Small animals that have been flooded out of their homes may seek shelter in yours. Use a pole or stick to turn things over before picking them up.

Look before you step. After a flood, the ground and floors are covered with debris and mud and may become very slippery.

Avoid wading through the flood water. Oils, vehicle fluids, chemicals and even raw sewage can mix with flood waters creating unsanitary and even hazardous conditions.

Be alert for gas leaks. Use a flashlight to inspect for damage. Don't smoke or use candles, lanterns or open flames unless you know for sure that the gas has been turned off and the area has been ventilated.


