- 5. 1st opening of the meeting to the public

Library addition – most of home is still intact - No one in house for 3 years -is not neglected- heated in winter has house and shed

- a. Deer Management, Presented by Dr. Michael Van Clef (Hopewell Township)

 Doctorate in ecology from Rutgers.

Survey Options: Infrared Helicopter, Resident Observation Survey, Planting seedlings to track damage

Statistics: Franklin above average at 1 harvest per 10 acres of land, but could attain 1 antlerless dear per 5 acres of land

Methods: Increasing Permit Goals of 2 Antlerless Dear per 10 acres . Van Clef opined that less hunters with better skills is more productive than more casual hunters. Farmers should inquire(if they do not already) acquiring special depredation hunting permits for crops damaged by deer.

Reporting: Create a web based/smart phone reporting system to collect more refined data. Integrate more Health Data into statistics regarding Lyme Disease.

Misc Info: Currently the Antlerless Deer Harvest is 78%. It costs \$200.00 to process a harvested deer.

- b. NJ Invasive Strike Team F. Varacalli asked if Franklin Twp. Should consider establishing a volunteer team to search and locate emerging invasive species. The Committee recommended that educating landowners against planting invasive plants by promoting the brochure from the NJ Invasive Strike Team has available. F. Varacalli will post on Twp. Web site and include in the Twp. Newsletter. It was also noted that educating landscaping companies to not sell invasive species is important.

 - a. Kingston School update Tuchman lease is signed!
- b. Native grasslands sub-committee update F. Varacalli stated the grassland plans are in order.

It was commented that development of active recreation parks includes amenities like pavement (for roads and parking) and those costs are included as the Open Space Trust Fund Ordinance under recreation.
