



HAMILTON STREET—NOW....

In 2014 the Township formed the Hamilton Street Advisory Board (HSAB) to provide guidance on the Township's continued efforts to revitalize the Hamilton Street corridor. The voting membership of the HSAB is comprised of Hamilton Street property owners, Hamilton Street business owners, a Hamilton Street resident and one at-large member. Non-voting members of the HSAC include Council members, as well as various Township employees, including the Township Manager.

Upon its formation, the HSAB conducted an analysis of the weaknesses and threats that may negatively affect the Township's ability to revitalize Hamilton Street, and identified the various opportunities and strengths that may be capitalized upon in these efforts.

One of the high priority objectives identified was the desire and need to spur revitalization through private investment and redevelopment, with the zoning of the area being identified as a weakness that was possibly thwarting private redevelopment in the area. The HSAB established a zoning subcommittee to investigate this matter and to offer zoning recommendations. That investigation resulted in the production of a report from the HSAB to the Township Planning Board outlining the HSAB's analysis of the Hamilton Street zoning and their recommended zoning changes for the area. Based on this report, the Township Council adopted new zoning regulations that have already resulted in the submittal of three major multi-million dollar, mixed-use development applications for Hamilton Street

In addition to the new development spurred by the zoning changes, the HSAB, in partnership with the Township, is implementing the following to further improve Hamilton Street: assignment of two dedicated Police officers to Hamilton Street; installation of new security cameras throughout the district; development of a street tree replacement plan; and additional streetscape improvements, including banners and flags.

The HSAB typically meets on the first Monday of each month at 7 p.m. in the Council Chambers in the Municipal building, located at 475 DeMott Lane.

Future Development

Three new projects for Hamilton Street have been proposed and are before the Township's Planning and Zoning Boards. All three include a mix of commercial and residential development. This influx of millions of dollars will help reinvigorate Hamilton Street. Scores of new people will live and shop in the area. In addition, the new projects will serve not only the new residents, but also the Township and region. It is expected that this fresh inflow of economic development will spur an even greater interest and development of Hamilton Street.

As such, Township staff are prepared to assist developers in expediting their projects.

The Township has purchased a vacant building on Lewis Street, formerly owned by the Somerset Community Action Program (SCAP), and plans to demolish the existing building and to construct a new youth/community center, which will have programs to target at-risk youth in the community.

AND THEN...

Some interesting facts about what once was called the Township's "Main Street," found in Franklin Township, Somerset County: A History by William B. Brahms.

Revolutionary Colonel John Graves Simcoe and the Queen's Rangers encountered the Americans just about where Franklin Boulevard meets Hamilton Street. The Americans injured Simcoe and killed his horse, and pursued the rest of the Rangers. Colonel Simcoe was taken to DeMott's Tavern located near Franklin Boulevard and Hamilton Street.

Along Hamilton Street, there were some mail-order catalog houses. These houses were sold by Sears from 1908 to 1940, and ranged in price from \$600 to \$5,100.

Franklin Township began to experience a shift away from a rural municipality after the turn of the century. By 1920, the area adjacent to New Brunswick (between Rt. 27 and Hamilton Street) was almost completely filled with residential structures.

In 1921, the four-room Hamilton School was built on Hamilton Street and Matilda Avenue at a cost of \$30,000. Toilets were 50 feet from the building in a very airy shed. Running water came from an outside pump. Two portable two-room buildings were erected at the rear of the structure for \$12,000 in 1951. From 1966 to 1985, the building was used for offices by the Board of Education. It was sold in 1985.

The farm of Jane Gibson, the "Pig Woman" who was a witness in the famous Hall-Mills murder trial in 1922, was on Hamilton Street near Churchill Avenue. The Hall-Mills murder case involved an Episcopal priest and a member of his choir with whom he was having an affair. Both were murdered on September 14, 1922. The suspected murderers, the priest's wife and her brothers, were acquitted in a 1926 trial. The case received national newspaper coverage. According to some reports, it would take the Lindbergh kidnapping trial in the 1930s to exceed the high profile of this case.

The East Franklin Volunteer Fire Company finished their firehouse at Hamilton Street in the 1930s. For lack of money, they were forced to lease their building to a service station. The station operator used it for his business while storing the fire truck there free. When the station's lease expired, the company again took over the building. They moved to Pinegrove Avenue in 1955. The Community Volunteer Fire Company began building their firehouse on Hamilton Street in 1946.

In December 1946, there was national publicity about the low-cost homes being built for World War II veterans and their families. More than a thousand sightseers showed up in June 1947 to see the model home that had opened on Hamilton Street. The Veterans Building Co-operative (VBC) fell on hard times and ended up bankrupt.

The Franklin Township Chamber of Commerce was organized in 1953 and incorporated in 1960. They focused mainly on businesses on Hamilton Street, addressing issues such as parking and zoning.

The Township's first Master Plan, adopted in 1958, said the best potential for business expansion was in the form of well-organized neighborhood centers and major regional shopping centers; one of the two recommended centers was along Hamilton Street, from Brookline Avenue to Franklin Boulevard.

The Franklin Township Public Library occupied the first floor of 935 Hamilton Street from 1971 until 1980. It is now used by the Township's Community Resource and Services Department.

The first post office substation in the vicinity was in the Township Pharmacy on Hamilton Street. A new post office was opened on Franklin Boulevard near Hamilton Street in 1961, which was the first time "Somerset" was used as a postal designation.

Rental Assistance Available

The Somerset County Rental Assistance Program is available to provide up to 15 months of rental assistance and monthly case management to eligible Somerset County residents.

The case management is provided by a trained volunteer and is intended to help clients set and achieve goals that promote long-term financial stability. The program provides a monthly subsidy to pay the difference between household rent and 30 percent of one's monthly income, up to a maximum of \$300 per month.

Applicants must be able to demonstrate that they will be able to afford their housing without rental assistance within 15 months. In order to qualify, at least one adult in the household must be employed, working at least 30 hours per week. Any non-working adult must have a verifiable disability or be a caregiver for a member of the household.

In addition, applicants must have a formal lease at a rental rate that is less than the fair-market rent for the unit size, and must be within the following maximum income limits:

1 Person - \$51,500

2 People - \$58,800

3 People - \$66,200

4 People - \$73,500

5 People - \$79,400 6 People - \$85,300

In addition, program participants must complete a monthly household budget, attend a monthly meeting with the program case manager, and be willing to accept case management services that include financial management, employment and/or any other services that are deemed necessary to maintain permanent housing in Somerset County.

Applicants who meet the criteria will be served on a first-come, first-served basis after being screened by the Somerset County Community Development Office. For more information call the office at (908) 541-5756.

Frequently Asked Questions?

What happens to all the Christmas trees that are picked up at the curb in January?

They are ground into wood mulch and given back to the residents and used in park landscaping areas.

How do I get rid of an old mattress?

Take it to the convenience center. Passes can be purchased at Public Works or the Municipal Clerk's office

How do I dispose of paint cans?

Oil-based paint is hazardous waste and has to be disposed of at one of Somerset County's hazardous waste collections. Latex-based paint can have to be dried out and can be put out in the regular trash.

Do I need a permit to repave my driveway or install a new sidewalk?

A permit is not required from the Construction Department, though you would need zoning approval if you were changing the size or configuration.

For those who love trivia...the latitude and longitude of Franklin is:

74 degrees 20 minutes west longitude, and 40 degrees and 30 minutes north latitude.

My neighbor heard that Verizon has been knocking on some residents' doors announcing that service was available to their street. Are they finally expanding into all of Franklin Township?

Under their agreement with the State of New Jersey, Verizon is required to provide service to 70 selected public entities in the State; New Brunswick and the original Princeton Borough are two that must have 100% service. This service 'bleeds' into some areas of Franklin. As Verizon continues the work in these neighboring communities, service will become available to some additional areas in Franklin. According to the Verizon representative, there are no current plans to expand into all areas in the Township.

My neighbor has one of those portable storage containers in their driveway. They said it was only temporary. Is that allowed?

Zoning approval is needed for these containers, even if they are temporary.

My car broke down on Easton Avenue and the Police Department called for a tow. It worked out, but how do I know they called the company that would be charging the least for the service?

The Township ordinance establishes criteria for licensing towing companies and a rotation system for towing of public vehicles. The ordinance also includes the maximum rate that can be charged by all towing companies. Chapter 390 of the Municipal Code has more details.

What are the restrictions on temporary portable inflatable pools?

Zoning and construction permits are required for any pool which (1) is 24 or more inches in depth; (2) has 250 square feet of water surface; and/or (3) has a filter and

IT'S 21 FOR A REASON Understand the Facts & Laws Regarding Underage Drinking

As Prom and Graduation season approaches, the Franklin Township Municipal Alliance for the Prevention of Substance Abuse (FTMAPSA) wants to remind parents about the price they will have to pay for their child's underage drinking.

Drinking alcohol under the age of 21 is illegal in New Jersey and will result in a \$500 fine, community service and loss of one's driver's license. Moreover, it is also a disorderly person's offense for adults to provide alcohol to any person under the age of 21, other than their own child in the privacy of their own home, i.e., a parent may give his or her children alcohol in their home for a religious occasion. The penalties for an adult providing alcohol to their children's under aged friends are a fine of up to \$1,000 and/ or up to six months imprisonment.

Parents can help:

- If your child is going to a party, find out where it is and call other parents to make sure it will be alcohol free;
- Keep your alcohol locked up so that your child won't have access to it; Check backpacks and purses at the door to make sure no alcoholic beverages are entering your home in the hands of teenagers; and
- · Refuse to buy alcohol for your child, or host a party where persons under 21 consume alcohol.

A clear community-wide message with support, responsibility, positive role models, alternative activities and positive social norms will help to further reduce use and abuse statistics and prevent senseless tragedies. FRANKLIN FOOD BANK'S ANNUAL **TOUR DE FRANKLIN CHARITY BIKE RIDE Sunday, April 24, 2016**

The Franklin Food Bank's annual Tour de Franklin Charity Bike Ride will be held on Sunday, April 24, 2016 at Franklin High School, 500 Elizabeth Ave in Somerset. In 2015, over 660 riders raised over \$60,000. The Tour began in 1989 when 30 riders banded together to raise \$1,500. Months of planning, support from many local businesses, and a team of over 100 volunteers come together with the cyclists and the community to make the day a success.

The Tour De Franklin is an opportunity to bring avid cyclists, local schools, and the Franklin Township community together for one day to support a local cause - fighting hunger. The day starts at 7:30 a.m., with a well-marked, on-road, 62-mile bike ride, followed by 40-mile, 25-mile, and 10-mile rides. A 1-to-5 mile neighborhood ride or walk is included, as well as a 1-to-10 mile ride or walk along the scenic D&R Canal path. Breakfast, lunch and break stops are provided. There is a free bike drawing, and t-shirts are guaranteed for all participants who register by April 1. Silver Riders who raise over \$150 and Gold Riders who raise over \$300 will also receive a special shirt.

Unfortunately, it looks like hunger is also here to stay. Demand for the Food Bank's services have increased approximately 10% each year since 2007, with close to 12,000 food packages provided to Franklin Township residents in 2015. The Food Bank seeks innovative ways to fight hunger, including managing a community garden, working with local farms for surplus produce, and collaborating with larger food networks. It is not a government agency and receives government funding only through targeted grants, making events like the Tour de Franklin even more important. While the \$60,000 raised by the Tour de Franklin sounds like a lot, it is a small fraction of the Food Bank's annual budget.
