Q: What does the birch tree, witch hazel shrub and beebalm flower have in common?


A: They are all plants that are *Native* to New Jersey and just a small list of the plants that benefit our environment. Native plans require little to no fertilizer, have low water requirements, and provide valuable food sources and shelter for native wildlife.

The New Jersey Invasive Species Strike Team is working to control invasive species to prevent significant ecological damages. They can affect the chemical makeup of the water, availability of resources, alter the food web and compete with native plants for resources. IS A RAIN GARDEN FOR YOU?

Homeowners with significant run-off are urged to consider installing a rain garden. This uniquely-designed garden is an engineered depression planted with wetnessenjoying shrubs and other plants that catch water running off a small area, retaining it until the water either sinks into the ground or evaporates. This protects downstream areas from eroding and streams from possibly polluting run-off that could flow into our water sources.

FRANKLIN ACQUIRES **OPEN SPACE**

A December 21, 2015 closing was held on 149 acres of land being deeded to the Somerset County Open Space program by land owners William H. Stavola and Trap Rock Industries, Inc., adding to the Township's 9,000-plus aces of preserved land.

Franklin Township will contribute ten percent of the \$4.25-million purchase price to the county. The property will remain in its natural state, with possible future trails being the only develop-

The property is bordered by County Route 518, Canal Road and Old Georgetown Road. The land is part of the South County Initiative, which currently consists of 95 acres. Referred to as the Millstone River Valley Initiative in the 2000 Parks Recreation and Open Space Master Plan Update, it is part of a long-term goal of 2,000 acres to be preserved in this area.

Because of suburban sprawl, preservation of the property is critical in order to maintain a habitat for animal species. The Carolina chickadee, Eastern box turtle and Cooper's hawk are some of the species found in forested wetlands within this area.

WHAT AM I DRINKING?

If you obtain your drinking water from a public water system, it is tested regularly for contaminants regulated by federal and state standards. Public community and non-community water systems must test on a strict schedule as well as at mandated points in their distribution system. Customer notification is required when a contaminant exceeds the standard.

If your water is from a private well, there is no testing requirement. Testing is only required for newly drilled wells or when a real estate transaction occurs. The latter is required by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, NJDEP, under the Private Well Testing Act, PWTA.

Franklin Township has stricter requirements than the NJDEP for newly drilled wells. These can be found in Chapter 384-7C(1) of the Municipal Code. A list of PWTA certified labs, along with the testing parameters, can be found at http://www.nj.gov/dep/watersupply/pw_pwta.html.

NJDEP recommends at a minimum your well be tested yearly for total coliform. They also recommend testing for lead and nitrates.

All tests should be conducted at a NJDEP certified lab. A list of certified labs can be found at http://datamine2. state.nj.us/DEP_OPRA/OpraMain/get_long_report?

Additional testing may be required if you detect changes in your water quality such as taste, odor, color or you live in an industrial area or near a gas station. As these tests can be expensive, you may want to contact the Health Department or Rutgers Cooperative Extension for advice.

Using The Wind To Your Advantage

As part of the Township's efforts to encourage energy efficiency and sustainability, the Township Zoning Ordinance permits Small Wind Energy Systems in our larger lot size zones (Agricultural, Canal Preservation, Rural Residential 3 and Rural Residential 5). A Small Wind Energy System (SWES) is a system that converts wind energy to electricity by means of a rotor to meet part or all of a building's energy requirements. It is intended for on-site use of the electricity, but excess power can be transferred to a utility company power grid pursuant to utility company interconnection agreements.

There are requirements to minimize any impact on neighboring properties: a minimum lot size of five acres, a minimum setback from the property line and height limitations.
